Shackleton Road going rat-free!

An enthusiastic bunch of residents in Mount Eden's Shackleton Road bonded during lockdown and decided they'd like to keep the rat numbers down in their neighbourhood. With the help of Urban Ark they got themselves the materials and tools to build their own rat trapping tunnels.

Last Sunday, about a dozen locals gathered and



spent a couple of hours building 20 tunnels, to be fitted with Victor Pro rat traps.

Main organiser, Joanne Harland, set the group up on Trap.nz so everyone can record their catches.
